Notice of College Funding Opportunities from the Post-High School Counseling Office November 2018

The Green Sheet will appear periodically in your mailbox as a means of informing your seniors about some college/career funding opportunities.

GENERAL

AXA Achievement Scholarship Program offers college scholarships to high school seniors who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their activities in school, the community or the workplace. Fifty-two state winners (including Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico) will have the opportunity to receive a \$2,500, \$10,000 or \$25,000 scholarship. In addition, for every student who wins a scholarship, a grant in the amount of \$1,000 will be made to the winner's school. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or legal residents and high school seniors who plan to enroll full-time in an accredited two- or four-year college by fall 2019. The 2019 program will be accepting applications from September 5, 2018 until 10,000 applications are submitted or December 14, 2018, whichever comes first. Your application **MUST** be one of the first 10,000 submitted electronically by the deadline date. *Apply early!*

The BigSun Organization is offering a scholarship to a student athlete regardless of the sport they participate in. Apply online at www.bigsunathletics.com. The deadline is June 19, 2019.

Bronfman Fellowship is among the most prestigious programs available to outstanding Jewish students of all backgrounds who will be entering the 12th grade in the fall of 2019 and be born before July, 2003. The purpose of the Fellowship is to invest in a cohort of talented young Jews who will become leaders in all areas of Jewish and public life. The program includes an all-expenses-paid five-week trip to Israel and two seminars in New York City where Fellows explore Jewish identity, Jewish ideas, and connect to other young Jews from both Israel and North America. **No Jewish educational background is required for eligibility.** They select Fellows who are religiously observant as well as those only marginally affiliated with Judaism. The \$10,000 awards are renewable. Applicants must be nominated by a community leader, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and demonstrate financial need. The Gen and Kelly Tanabe Scholarship is a \$1,000 merit-based award. Applicants are evaluated by an independent panel of judges. The Golden Apple Scholars of Illinois program annually identifies, recruits and prepares students for successful teaching careers in high-need schools throughout Illinois. Scholars must agree to teach for five years in an Illinois school that serves low income students or has below-par test scores. In exchange, Scholars receive four years of financial assistance at one of 52 public and private universities across the state. Golden Apple Scholars also participate in summer programs that include teaching internships and enhanced teacher preparation (total assistance value \$23,000). Korean Spirit and Culture Promotion Project is holding its eleventh national essay contest for Middle & High School students.
