

# SAMPLE FOUR-YEAR SCHEDULES

## of Students Taking Multiple Performing/Visual Arts Electives

Students and their families often wonder how it is possible to participate in the performing and visual arts while maintaining a comprehensive course of study at New Trier. A schedule that includes multiple courses in the performing and visual arts will still allow students to take all of the courses needed for admission to a wide range of college and universities. Please note that taking two or three electives may necessitate taking summer school and/or early bird courses.
